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

The organisation supports and amplifies the sounds of tomorrow by nurturing the creation, performance, and appreciation of new music for adventurous listeners in South Africa and beyond; and plays a key role as a national and international supporter, connector, and advocate for the whole new music community in South Africa.

OVERVIEW ABOUT ISCM





The International Society for Contemporary Music (ISCM) is a premier forum for the advancement, dissemination and interchange of new music from around the world. Through the ISCM, its members (60 sections in all continents) promote contemporary music in all its varied forms, strengthening music life in their local contexts and making their music and its creators known to the world. Since 1923, the International Society for Contemporary Music has organized an annual festival, presently called the ISCM World New Music Days, which takes place in a different country every year. The music being presented at these festivals is generally made up of compositions contributed by the individual member organizations that form the ISCM's international network.

The World New Music Days is an annual contemporary music festival organised by the International Society for Contemporary Music (ISCM). NewMusicSA will host in South Africa the centennial and first-ever African edition of the ISCM World New Music Days between November 24 and December 3 2023. The festival will bring together in Gauteng (Soweto and Johannesburg) and Cape **Town** orchestras, ensembles, composers, performers, conductors, programmers and other music and performing arts professionals from all over the world for 10 days of music, residencies, workshops, masterclasses and exhibitions. The program is set to have a strong Pan-African approach, creative exchanges with Europe, entry to international markets, and attention to the diaspora.
